The club has a legal duty of care to its players, staff, officials and supporters to ensure their physical and mental health is protected, as set out in the Health & Safety at work Act and management of Health and Safety at Work regulations. - Club toilets will be closed except for emergencies or players with medical conditions.

- Gel stations will be provided by the club in the ground but gel before you enter the ground.
- Maintain social distancing in line with government and F.A. guidelines.
- PLAYERS / MANAGEMENT that have an underling health condition must inform the team manager who will then seek further advice.
- Players, management & officials must inform the club if they believe the training or club environment poses a risk to their wellbeing or mental health.
- Familiarise yourselves with COVID-19 protocols, understand and follow them.
- Manage your own health and wellbeing by adopting a good health behaviours.
- Support each other with mental well-being.
- Agree to follow club and F.A. current guidelines regarding training. The team management will be kept constantly informed. A website link will be sent to all players and management for the F.A. and league guidelines.

If a team member / management believes that training or some aspect of it is putting their safety or wellbeing at risk they should, in the first instance speak to the team manager or team management. The discussion should cover your concern and if not resolved then contact the COVID COORDINATOR.
